harles Sullivan has served as Executive Director of the Cambridge (Massachusetts) Historical Commission since 1974. He graduated from Dartmouth College with a B.A. in geography in 1965 and received a master's degree in city planning from the Harvard Graduate School of Design in 1970. At the Cambridge Historical Commission, Sullivan has over-seen the expansion of the city's historic districts, secured designation of landmarks and neighborhood conservation districts, and gained city-wide jurisdiction over demolition of buildings more than fifty years old. He has helped establish a role for historic preservation in Cambridge's planning and zoning activities, as well as in the city's relations with Harvard University and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Mr. Sullivan is the co-author of A Photographic History of Cambridge (1984), Maintaining Your Old House in Cambridge (1988), and Building Old Cambridge: Architecture and

Development (forthcoming). He is also is a member of the Massachusetts Historical Commission and the Massachusetts Historical Society. He is also a former president of the Cambridge Historical Society and a former trustee of Historic New England.

1. Boylston Street

Boylston Street is an east-west thoroughfare in Boston steeped in history. From its early days as Frog Lane and Common Street, the road has become an artery connecting several quintessentially Boston sites. This 3 mile route will lead you from Boston Common, the nation's oldest public park, past Copley Square, site of both the Boston Public Library and the marathon bombings, to Fenway Park, home of the Boston Red Sox. There are many excellent eateries and shops along the way.

Cost: Purchase of one-way subway fare (\$2.65)

2. The Boston Waterfront

Before Boston was a hub for the new intellectual economy, it was one of America's most powerful ports, and the Boston Seaport District has much to show tourists about both its past and present. This strand will incorporate views of Boston Harbor, including water travel, and seeing some of the most avante garde art on display in the city.

Out-of-Pocket Costs: Purchase of round-trip subway fare (\$5.30), water shuttle (\$12) and Institute of Contemporary Art Admission (\$10)

3. Harvard Square and the Harvard Art Museums

Plan your trip to Harvard Square on foot following the Charles River (upstream 2 miles) or take local bus #47. Once there, enter the gates of Harvard Yard to admire the architectural beauty of America's oldest college and then explore the bounty of the Harvard Art Museums—the Fogg Museum, Busch-Reisinger Museum, and Arthur M. Sackler Museum. Return on foot (2 miles) via trendy Central Square (or local bus).

Out-of-Pocket Costs: museum admission (\$10); bus fare (\$2.10 each way). Note: People with mobility limitations can show their room key to get a free shuttle ride to and from Harvard Square.

4. Kendall Square and the MIT Museum

Forget the subway and take this 2.2-mile techno-walk starting at our hotel. In this strand you will stroll along the Charles River to the MIT Campus, play at the interactive MIT Museum, eat lunch in Kendall Square, tour the ultra-modern STATA center and return to the hotel via the main MIT campus avenue.

Out-of-Pocket Costs: museum admission (\$5)

Note: People with mobility limitations can show their hotel room key to get a free shuttle ride to and from Kendall Square, or take the local bus (route CT2).

5. Freedom Trail


The Freedom Trail is a 2.5-mile walking route that leads you to 16 historically significant sites, including Paul Revere's home, meetinghouses, churches, burying grounds, Bunker Hill and the USS Constitution. Learn about the brave people who shaped our nation, and the rich history of the American Revolution, as it began in Boston, where every step tells a story.

Out-of-Pocket Costs: Purchase of round-trip subway fare (\$5.30).

6. Black Heritage Trail

Located on Boston's Beacon Hill, the Black Heritage Trail serves to commemorate the free black population that settled in Boston in the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries. This 2-mile trail will lead you from the Massachusetts State House on Beacon Street, then to any of the 14 historical sites located on the heritage trail circling Beacon Hill. Students will then travel down Beacon Street to Faneuil Hall, which has been a marketplace and meeting hall since 1743.

Out-of-Pocket Costs: Purchase of round-trip subway fare (\$5.30); Optional admission to the Museum of African American History (\$5).



Michael Patrick MacDonald grew up in the Old Colony Housing Project in South Boston, a neighborhood that held the highest concentration of white poverty in the United States. After losing four of his eleven siblings and seeing his generation decimated by poverty, crime, addiction, and incarceration, he learned to transform personal and community trauma by becoming a leading Boston activist, organizer and writer.

MacDonald is the author of the New York Times Bestselling memoir, All Souls: A Family Story From Southie and the acclaimed Easter Rising: A Memoir of Roots and Rebellion. These two books are often selected as First Year Experience reads, for which MacDonald regularly speaks at colleges and universities. He has been awarded an American Book Award, A New England Literary Lights Award, and a fellowship at the Rockefeller Foundation's Bellagio Study Center. MacDonald has written a number of essays and short stories, including The Resurrection of Cornelius Larkin and An Immigrant's Tale, written for the Dropkick Murphy's

theme album "Going Out in Style." He is also a regular contributor to The Boston Globe's Op Ed page and is Senior Contributing Editor at the Schuster Institute for Investigative Journalism at Brandeis University.

As an activist, MacDonald has focused his efforts on multi-cultural coalition, building to reduce violence and promote grassroots leadership from our most impacted communities. He has developed Gun Buyback programs and local support groups, which give voice to adult and youth survivors of poverty, violence and the drug trade. MacDonald is on many local and national boards, including the Children's Defense Fund's Beat The Odds Essay Selection Committee, Crittenton Women's Union National Advisory Com-mittee and Families First of Greater Boston Advisory Board.

Michael Patrick MacDonald serves as Author-in-Residence at Northeastern University's Honors Department, where he teaches his curricula: "Non-Fiction Writing & Social Justice Issues" and "The North of Ireland: Conflict, Reconciliation, and a Lasting Peace with Justice" every fall. He has been Guest Lecturer at California State University, Northridge CA and at The University of Mannheim, Germany. He was appointed Distinguished Writer in Residence at UMass Boston Honors College, and has accepted the position of Senior Fellow at the Center for Peace, Democracy and Development at the McCormack Institute for Social Policy and Global Studies.

MacDonald is currently developing *All Souls* as a TV series and is working on his third book, which will use narrative non-fiction storytelling to reveal issues of generational trauma in our communities. In addition, he has developed a community-based writing and healing curriculum which has been implemented with the Crittenton Women's Union in Boston, to help women who are transitioning out of poverty find their voices on the page and in the world. In Fall 2015, he worked with Boston survivors of homicide victims, telling their stories of transforming trauma and finding voice.







